

# **Long Range Precision Rifle competition**

## **General rules**

1. Always point your rifle in a safe direction. Never point a rifle at anything you don't intend to kill or destroy.
2. Always keep your rifle unloaded until ready to use. Treat all rifles as though they are loaded even if you believe otherwise.
3. Keep your finger out of the trigger guard until you are ready to fire.
4. Know your target and what is beyond.
5. Always wear proper eye and ear protection and ensure others have the same before firing. Hearing protection optional for shooters with suppressed rifles.

## **Authorized Rifles**

Any bolt action or semi-automatic rifle chambered in 5.56 or 308.

# Course of Fire

## 200 and 300 yard targets

Shooter will assume a shooting position behind the wall at firing line number 1, marked with yellow flags. At the command to **LOAD** from the Range Officer, the shooter will load his/her rifle.

At the command to **FIRE**, the shooter will fire five rounds on the 200 yard target, then transition to the 300 yard target and fire five more rounds.

After firing 10 rounds from the position wall, the shooter will place his/her weapon on safe and show the Range Officer a clear chamber. Once receiving the command to **MOVE** from the Range Officer, the shooter will move quickly to firing line number 2, marked with orange flags, and assume a prone position.

\*The shooter must keep the muzzle of their rifle pointed downrange and on safe during the transition between firing lines.\*

## 350, 400 and 450 yard targets

Once the shooter assumes a prone position on firing line number 2, he/she will fire 5 rounds each, in order, on the 350, 400 and 450 yard targets. The shooter need not wait for a command from the Range Officer to begin engaging targets.

The timer will begin once the shooter fires receives the command to **FIRE** from firing line number 1 and stop at the final round fired from firing line number 2.

The total rounds fired for this course is 25. All shooters are responsible for maintaining on their person the proper amount of ammunition required to complete the course.

\*The shooter must maintain a safe muzzle direction while performing reloads.\*

## **Scoring**

The shooters will be scored based on their times to fire all 25 rounds on the targets. All misses will result in a deduction of 10 seconds each.

In the event any of the shooters run the course in the same time, a tie-breaking round will be conducted. The tie-breaking round will consist of a repeat of the course of fire from firing line number 2 for time.
